

unsolicited fax messages for advertising. As you know, fax machines are very popular today and there are some who are taking advantage of that to mail out advertising...or not mail out but faxing advertising of the businesses that receive these or individuals that receive these who do not want to have this information. In some cases, their machines are tied up by the advertising. The cost to them in the paper is borne by the receiver. And it's supported by the Federation of Independent Business to stop the unsolicited use of fax machines for advertising purposes. If you want to receive the material, you could, but you would have the option to choose that or not to choose it. This bill would stop the unsolicited advertising through fax machines. I would move for the advancement of the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Is there any discussion? Seeing none, we will proceed to vote on the advancement of LB 408. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the advancement of 408.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 408 is advanced. We will now go to LB 766.

CLERK: Mr. President, 766 was a bill introduced by Senator Hartnett. (Read title.) The bill was introduced January 23, referred to Appropriations, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, this bill deals with the SAC Museum. The state does not own the SAC Museum, it simply...the state operates it under a lease from the federal government. The bill does three things, authorizes the Governor to divest the state of the interest in a lease to a private nonprofit group if the private group is an appropriately financially responsible nonprofit Nebraska entity. Prior to the transfer, the federal government agrees to the transfer of the museum and the private group commits in writing to retain the museum and future improvements at the current location of the museum for full term of the lease. Second, the state transfers fund to the second Cash Fund to the new group when the transfer of the lease takes place. There is no General Fund money with this and this money is simply raised from gifts from the gift
