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SOS temporary employee pool. Basically what this is, it allows the Department of Personnel to...the authority for agencies to come to them, pay them money for temporary employees. There's been more activity in this fund than anticipated and if we do not increase the authority, the Cash Fund authority, they will not be able to continue doing this once the authority runs out. The problem with that is that would, in all likelihood, the authority would run out before the Department of Revenue really has a bulk of activity in April and the Department of Revenue would not be able to hire temporary employees for the April 15th tax collection crunch. And so that's just some additional Cash Fund authority to the Department of Personnel for temporary employees. The last issue is probably the biggest dollarwise. It's \$111,000 this year, annualized impact of \$436,000 in '91-92, and \$438,000 in '92-93. What this is, it would actually purchase a portion of a satellite and GTE Spacenet III. It's a double width transponder. You may remember a few years back we leased this through 1993. Our lease expires in 1993, we have to do something else. What this would do...that is what we actually leased on Spacenet II, this would purchase a transponder, double width transponder on Spacenet III, this would purchase it and the expected life is through 1999. The reason, I guess, that we feel this needs to be an emergency deficit is that GTE is selling space on Spacenet III right now. We have a negotiated agreement that if we move ahead soon, we can, hopefully, to begin with, save the difference between \$6.9 million and \$6.5 million; \$6.9 million is the price that we paid if we just wait till our lease expires. I'm moving forward now, one, we save \$400,000 by doing it and in completing and signing the...inking the contract as soon as we can. Two is that there are a variety of people that are interested in this double width transponder and if we don't buy it, somebody else may well do it. It's one of those things we know we're going to have to do something in '93. We know we're going to have to spend some money and the total anticipated cost between now and 1999 will be \$6.5 million. If we do not do this, we'll have to do something else that will in all likelihood cost more money and may not have all the abilities of this double width transponder which it allows us to do ETV and public radio and a variety of things on NEB-SAT that we're moving forward and doing. So those are the five issues in the bill. I ask for...we will need, the committee will need 30 votes to introduce this bill and place it on General File. And so we have had trouble getting 25 this morning, I hope we can get 30 to suspend the rules and move ahead.
