PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to advance LB 278. All those in favor please vote aye. Opposed nay. LB 278 is advanced. LB 385.

CLERK: LB 385, Senator, I have no amendments pending.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the advancement of LB 385 to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to advance LB 385. All those in favor please vote aye. Opposed nay. LB 385 is advanced. LB 455.

CLERK: LB 455, I have E & R pending, first of all, Senator.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 455.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments. All those in favor...Senator Wesely, do you wish to be...all those in favor of the motion to adopt the E & R amendments please vote aye. Opposed nay. The E & R amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Senator Wickersham would move to amend the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Thank you, Madam Chairman and members of the body, this is a simple amendment. It is required by the Board of Examiners for the nursing home administrators. They were uncomfortable with the language that we had amended into the bill allowing them to waive the one-year practice requirement. They wish us to amend the bill by simply striking the one-year practice requirement and deleting the option for them to waive that practice requirement. They advise us that it is not a problem, that the practice in the states is now uniform enough that they can rely on the training and the requirements in other states and they don't think the one-year practice requirement makes any sense any longer.
