ASSISTANT CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. President, I move the advancement of LB 218 to E & R for engrossment.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: You've heard the motion to advance LB 218 to E & R for engrossment. All in favor say aye. Opposed say nay. It is advanced. LB 297.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Before we get to 297, Mr. President, Senator Hartnett has asked me to announce that the Urban Affairs Committee will have an executive session at eleven-thirty this morning under the south balcony. That is Urban Affairs at eleven-thirty, south balcony. On 297 I do have E & R amendments.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 297.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: You've heard the motion for adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 297. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. The amendments are adopted.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Next item, Mr. President, Senator Hall would move to amend. His amendment is on page 998.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. President. Oh, okay. I forgot this amendment was on here, so it's clearly not that important. But it does, Mr. President, deal with the issue of the timing. The bill drafters, E & R felt that this amendment was beyond the scope of an E & R amendment. It makes the change with regard to the timing. The bill had always said July 1, 1991. The way it was drafted, there is a need to have an emergency clause on there. The bill always had that on there. It stays on there, the amendment doesn't affect that. But we have to shift it around so that when the bill takes effect with the signature that...and then in the bill it says it's effected July 1, that there isn't a time frame, a window there where there is no minimum wage, in effect.
