time or more". So this would allow a kindergarten teacher to become tenured in a school system over a six year period rather than a three year period for a full-time teacher. I think this is only fair and would encourage the adoption...or the advancement of LB 166.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Senator Withem, I understand you have committee amendments.

SENATOR WITHEM: Yes, we do have committee amendments. Senator Coordsen brought this bill, and we thought it was a good idea, but we needed to make minor, minor improvement in it. Basically, what it does, there was...when 166 was initially drafted, there was a section of the statute that was not included in the original bill that needs to be included in order to make...to harmonize provisions of the statutes. So all this does is it amends Section 79-12107, which was not a portion of the original bill. Instead of it being a simple one-page bill, it will now be a simple two-page bill. So I'd urge your adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Withem. Are there any senators who wish to debate the committee amendments? Seeing none, we will proceed to vote on the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 166. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the committee amendments? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of committee amendments, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The committee amendments are adopted. Are there any senators who wish to speak on the motion to advance LB 166? Seeing none, we will vote on the motion to advance. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 166 is advanced. LB 199.

ASSISTANT CLERK: LB 199 was a bill that was introduced by Senator Lynch. (Read title.) The bill was read for the first time on January 11 of this year, referred to the General Affairs
