

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: That's right.

SENATOR MOORE: Is there anything in this program that would allow you to identify someone before med school, pay into the program, and so the agreement is they will enter into this program and the community will pay the cost and assist in paying for them? Does it have anything to do with that...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: No.

SENATOR MOORE: ...or it's strictly after the fact?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: It's strictly after the fact,...

SENATOR MOORE: Okay.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: ...at the present time, yeah.

SENATOR MOORE: Thank you.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: And it's mainly because we don't have the funds in there at the present time. We'd have to have this community enter into a contract, some way, to make sure that that individual went back there.

SENATOR MOORE: But that is not possible with this bill. What I am thinking is, is there a possibility this bill where a community has someone that understands their community, and if they go to med school, could come back? Is there something in this bill...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Well, they can...

SENATOR MOORE: ...that would allow a community to do something on the front end of that, while they're still an undergraduate, to actually help them defray the cost of education with this program, with the agreement they come back? You're saying this bill doesn't work quite like that.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Well, it is...it would be possible, but there is nothing in here that would make that happen.
