PRESIDENT MOUL: Would you try and vote now again. Okay. How would you like to vote? Okay. Have you all voted? Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Madam Chairman, it looks like we may have to go to a call of the house and a roll call vote.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 13 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. All members who are not excused, please return to the Chambers and record your presence. Unauthorized personnel, please leave the floor. Please check in, and we will have a roll call vote. Will you please check in. We're looking for Senators Chambers and Conway. Senator Beyer, Senator Chizek, Senator Hall. Senator Schrock, and Senator Wesely, please check in. Senator Pirsch, Senator Rogers, please check in. Senator Moore and Senator Rasmussen. We're still looking for Senator Moore. Senator Moore is on his way. Do you wish to proceed, Senator Labeledz? Okay, we'll proceed with the roll call vote on the Labeledz amendment to the amendments. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Because so many were off the floor, could there be a statement of what the amendment is.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Labeledz. By the Clerk? Okay, Mr. Clerk.
