CLERK: Mr. President, 54, by Senator Schmit, found on page 1065, congratulates the Wahoo High School boys' basketball team.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members, the Wahoo High School boys' basketball team won their fourth straight Class B Boys' State High School Basketball Championship with a victory over York. I apologize to Scotty Moore and to Senator Elroy Hefner for this, but it is a fact of life that Wahoo has I think one of the most outstanding basketball teams that we've seen in the State of Nebraska for many, many years. And they have now extended their winning streak to 90 games. It's also an unprecedented record. I think, again, as I mentioned earlier in LR 53, that it demonstrates the kind of competitiveness, spirit, and cooperation that is necessary for success, not just in the field of athletics, but also in the field of business and industry, agriculture and professionalism. The boys' basketball team there has been an outstanding team, they've been well coached and well advised, and I want to add my congratulations and the congratulations of the Nebraska Legislature to the many that they've already received. I move for the adoption of the resolution.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is there any discussion of LR 54? Seeing none, we will proceed to vote on LR 54. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on LR 54. Have you all voted? We're voting on LR 54. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.
