

CLERK: Mr. President, 59, introduced by Senator Schmit, found on page 1072 of the Journal, congratulates Wahoo Bishop Neumann High School.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members, just want to add one more resolution in congratulations for the Wahoo Bishop Neumann girls' basketball team. They participated in the Class C State High School Basketball Tournament. They won 16 of 21 games this last season. And I think it's important that we recognize the academic, athletic, and artistic achievements of the youth of our state, and I think particularly of the City of Wahoo. We have asked, and others have shown some interest in declaring Wahoo the sports capital of the state. I think it's very unusual that a community of this size would have the kind of athletic record that we do have at Wahoo. And I know that the community is proud of them, the county is proud of them, we are all proud of them. And I add my congratulations and ask that this Legislature join myself in congratulating the Wahoo Bishop Neumann High School girls' basketball team on their achievements in the 1990 and '91 season. I move for the adoption of the resolution.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Schmit. Is there discussion? Senator Morrissey.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. I would support Senator Schmit's resolution, but I would probably be negligent if I didn't add that Father Bob Roe, from Falls City Sacred Heart, might take exception to his declaration of them being the sports capital of the state. And I would be remiss if I didn't mention the fact that I haven't turned in a resolution for the Falls City Sacred Heart High boys' basketball team because...for winning their fourth State Tournament in a row, because if I had done that over the last few years I've been here I probably would have taken a whole day of the session, and I didn't think it would be appropriate, considering they won boys' basketball, football, and track last year, basketball again this year for the fourth time in a row, and actually football two years in a row. But I'd urge you to support Senator Schmit's resolution. Thank you.
