SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right. Right, but I mean as far as what is actually retained as a record based on testimony and the submission of evidence, only that which is presented in the trial court would go to the appellate court?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That is correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then, if there is an appeal from the appellate court which is accepted by the Supreme Court, then you, again, would use only the record that was compiled in the trial court?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That is clearly my understanding.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, and it is mine, too, but I wanted that clear because as we proceed this can become somewhat confusing. I doubt that anybody is going to be listening other than those who are trained in the law, and Senator Kristensen, who is the water carrier for the court system. In fact, Senator Kristensen reminds me of Gunga Din in this instance and, Senator Kristensen, after Gunga Din had tended the British under fire, do you know where he wound up? And that is based on a poem written by Rudyard Kipling. You've heard of Rudyard Kipling. There was a youngster who was trying to find out the answer about the birds and the bees, and he said, when his father had explained it to him, and this will bring us to Kipling.
