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It all started with a broken sibling, in the words of the famous Rudyard Kipling." So that brings me to the Gunga Din story. He is a guy who was an Indian. He blew the trumpet against his own people to help the British, and in exchange for that, he was immortalized by Rudyard Kipling, but Gunga Din, despite having blown the whistle on his own people, did not go to Heaven. He wound up going to Hell, and continued squatting over the coals serving the British in Hell after having done such a good thing in the eyes of Rudyard Kipling.

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So I just hope after you have done all this yeoperson work for the court system, you don't wind up in a similar set of circumstances by the courts not carrying out the role and function that you would have in mind. The question that I would ask of you is this, and I know you won't have much time to answer...yes, Senator Kristensen, and then I will put my light on. Currently, there are three layers of courts, county, district, and Supreme Court. The insertion of the appellate court could require a person, who now only has two steps to go to the Supreme Court, would now have three. Would you agree with that, potentially?

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Worst case scenario, potentially, yes.

SPEAKER BAACK: Ten seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I will turn my light on.

SPEAKER BAACK: We will now go to Senator Wehrbein. Did you wish to discuss the amendment? Senator Kristensen, did you wish to discuss the amendment?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes, Mr. Speaker, members, in response, I have talked with Senator Wickersham. He had several variations of this. Certainly the purpose of the amendment and that which was promoted throughout the election, at least from my point of view being the one who did a lot of that, that we wanted the court not to solely sit in Lincoln, that the appellate court is an easier one to take out to the people. At the same time, you don't want to say you shall sit in cities X, Y, and Z because you tie down and we want to provide the flexibility to handle
