

SENATOR SMITH: Well, I may have to ask for a call of the house. I'm not quite ready to do that yet. And, if there is another hand, I'll have to ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote, please.

SPEAKER BAACK: We have a request for a call of the house. We will do a machine vote on that. All those in favor of the house going under call vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

CLERK: Mr. President, 67A was a bill introduced by Senator Schmit. (Read title.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I believe 67A appropriates around \$40,000, give or take a few thousand dollars, to implement LB 67, which is the design to assist in the closing of unlicensed solid waste facilities in second class cities and villages. I just want to point out this morning I received a letter from the Village of Mead that pointed out that they had spent more than \$16,000 to close down their facility, and had done so, of course, voluntarily. That is just one of many letters that I received along the same vein. And I would hope that, if there is going to be any attempt made to provide financial assistance to cities and villages that have not closed down their facilities but have delayed that activity, that we
