

examine those issues and thus I think you will get even better precedential cases written by the Supreme Court. They're not inferior now. They're adequate but I tell you as that volume goes along it will get worse.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If one thing is better than another, is that than which it is better inferior? If A is better than B, is B inferior to A?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then one thing can be better without being superior?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then if one thing cannot be better without being superior, how can one thing be less good without being inferior?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: That goes in a circle.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, it's the converse of...

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...what you're saying. Well, let me go ahead and state what Senator Kristensen cannot state but which his answers told us, what the Supreme Court is cranking out now is inferior work. They are not good judges doing good work, they are good judges doing inferior work. When we add nine judges in the appellate court, we're not going to have better judges but we're still going to have better justice. He's got to...he's got to say these kind of things because he's got a position he must maintain at all cost. Into the valley of death rode the 600. He's got to...there are cannons to the right, cannons to the left, cannons in front, but he's got his orders and when somebody raises the cutlass and drops it and says, charge, he's got to charge and that's what he's done. Fortunately, he's charging into unloaded cannons. One person on this floor is willing to stand and engage in the battle but he is so heavily armored that he's got no problem.
