

Senator Wesely, do you care to close?

SENATOR WESELY: Yeah, I understand Senator Beutler's concern. I know he's going to have an amendment following that will help clarify a little bit more of the bill. My point is simply that we don't now report less than \$100 in terms of gifts and other types of items in your statement of financial interest, there is no reason. We don't report any honorarium now that we would do it for those that are less than \$100. That seems to be the base on which we have started that reporting mechanism so I would ask that we make it consistent and I would ask for your support for the amendment.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Wesely was closing. There's two lights that have come on. There was a motion...

SENATOR WESELY: That's fine, if people want to discuss it, I don't mind.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Pirsch and Senator Beutler...or Senator Beutler both had lights on. They're waiving, Senator. The motion is to adopt the Wesely amendment. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Requires 25 votes. Have you all voted? Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I would ask for a call of the house.

SENATOR WARNER: Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay for a call of the house. The house is under call. (Journal page 1163 shows the vote as 26 ayes, 0 nays for a call of the house.) Members will record their presence. Please return to the Chamber. The house is under call. Senator Wesely, were you wanting roll call vote?

SENATOR WESELY: I suppose.

SENATOR WARNER: Senators Moore, Schimek and Chambers, if you would come in for a call of the house. Senator Wehrbein. Senator Schimek, do you want to record your presence, please. Senator Wehrbein. Okay, everyone is present. Do you wish for a roll call vote, Senator Wesely? Roll call vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken.) Mr. President, I need to verify.
