

railroad. They offered me 120 bucks and expenses to come out and speak. That's very reasonable. The other speakers on the forum were getting a 1,000 bucks a pop. My 120 was very unreasonable in that comparison. How would you address that as opposed to your amendment?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, Senator Morrissey, I really don't want to get dragged into a whole bunch of examples, because I think you do need to know the details of every situation.

SENATOR WARNER: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: But, just off hand, it doesn't sound unreasonable to me what you were getting, at all.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Okay, thank you. I guess I would end by supporting LB 232. There's definitely a need. I think my situation shows that very clearly that they couldn't tell me, yes, that's fine. It was muddy, in their opinion, and we need to clarify situations like that. But Senator Beutler's amendment, I'm still uncomfortable with it for the reason Senator Chambers has raised in his last discussion. Thank you.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Hartnett, followed by Senator Chambers.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President, I'll call the question.

SENATOR WARNER: Question has been called for. Do I see five hands? I see five hands. Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Motion is to cease debate. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: I'll have a call of the house and a roll call vote on ceasing debate. Machine vote instead, Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: Call of the house is requested. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Clerk will ring the bell. Record, Mr. Clerk. House is under call. Please record your presence. House is under call. Members, please return to their desks, record your presence. Clerk will take call ins. Motion is to cease debate. House is under call. Members please return to the Chamber, record your presence, and you may call in your vote.
