CLERK: 22 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to go under call.

SENATOR CONWAY: The house is under call. Will all members please report to the Chamber.

SPEAKER BAACK PRESIDING

SPEAKER BAACK: Would the members please check in. The house is under call. Please check in. Senator Haberman, please check in. Senator Lindsay, please check in. Senator Bernard-Stevens, please report to the Chamber. We need Senators Chambers and Warner. We're looking for Senator Ashford, Senator Chambers, and Senator Warner. Senator Wehrbein has said that we should go ahead and proceed with the roll call vote. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1257 of the Legislative Journal.) 31 ayes, 10 nays on adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted. Anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator...

SPEAKER BAACK: Raise the call.

CLERK: ...Withem would move to amend.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Withem.

SENATOR WITHEM: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, my amendment deals with the Schmit amendment that was adopted yesterday. If you recall, Senator Schmit suggested that...offered an amendment that he indicated was offered on behalf of some backhoe operators who are being forced to be tested and certificated and do...jump through a lot of hoops to be in the process of digging holes to put these tanks in, and also digging holes to take out the tanks. And he offered an amendment that purported to deal with that problem. As it turns out, what the amendment actually did was it said that the Fire Marshal's Office could no longer certify...require certification of people who install or replace
