

covered, if they are registered and registration is above 1,100 gallons, if there is a release from an aboveground tank, they do qualify, under this program, for remedial cleanups. So they are covered as well as the underground tanks. With that, I guess I would simply ask, after two days of debate on this important issue, that the body advance LB 409 to Select File. And, in the meantime, I'm more than happy to work with the others to ensure that some of the deficiencies are covered. With that, Mr. Speaker, I would give the rest of my time to Senator Robak.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Robak, you have about two minutes.

SENATOR ROBAK: Okay. I just want to say this is my priority bill and it's very important to the small communities in my district, it's either this bill or they close up. And we need their services in our community, and we need the jobs they provide. And I just urge you advance this bill today. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the closing. We will now proceed to vote on the advancement of LB 409. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker, members, the A bill simply reflects the money needed to carry out the program. And I've been asked, by Senator Beyer, if the money comes out of General Fund or where it comes from. It's my understanding it will come out of the fund itself through the cash fees. So I don't believe we're looking at any General Fund dollar support here.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is there any discussion of LB 409A? Seeing none, Senator Johnson, do you wish to close? Waives closing. We will now proceed to vote on the advancement of LB 409A. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.
