Hefner's amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Lynch would move to amend.

Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Madam President and members, I did support the
effort by Senator Hefner, as I stated earlier. The intention of
the law was, in fact, to...certainly did not include making a
paid holiday. However, it would be really appropriate if we
could begin this holiday in 1991. To do that we would need an
E clause and my amendment simply provides the E clause to LB 199
and I would appreciate your support.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lynch. Does anyone wish to
speak to this amendment? Seeing none, we will proceed to vote
on the Lynch amendment. All those in favor please vote aye,
opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator
Lynch's amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the advancement of LB 199
to E & R for grossment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to advance LB 199. All
those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. LB 199 is
