by Senator Warner and in his amendment he changes this date that we're talking about to July 1, 1994 instead of '95 and he recognizes that the value of doing this at the biennial budget formulation time might be better and has agreed that if this amendment passes, that the 1995 instead of '94 would be a part of his amendment. Is that the way...am I understanding correctly, Senator Warner? He's nodding yes and so I would ask you to accept this amendment to the committee amendments. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Elmer. We will now vote on the motion to adopt the amendment to the committee amendments. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of the amendment to the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Senator Warner would move to amend the committee amendments, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, this amendment is on page 1259. It also was passed out the other day. It's AM0869 and, Mr. Clerk, I need to ask to withdraw and refile.

CLERK: That would be technically correct, yes, sir.

SENATOR WARNER: I would ask unanimous consent to withdraw what I filed, what you see in the Journal and refile which is the identical same amendment with the exception of the change in date that Senator Elmer just indicate to you, if you look on the amendment, why the number 10 is insert 1994, and I rewrote that to be 1995 to be consistent with the previous amendment that was just adopted. The rest of it is all identical. The bulk of this amendment would be...it's technical in nature and is not necessarily considered a substantive amendment. The first portion of the amendment affects the Administrative Procedure Act and what rules and regulations that the coordinating commission would be making and how they are to be handled and it does except from that those constitutional responsibilities
