

education. And it refers to page 24 of the original bill. And what that does is approval or disapproval of existing education centers, or new centers. And I have a little bit of a technical change. My first amendment, which did not get printed in the Journal, says that on page 24, line 12, strike "disapproved" and insert "approved". And on line 13, strike "approved" and insert "disapproved". And then I also changed the date from March 1, 1992 to June 30, 1992, thinking that two months was not enough time. My second amendment, which is printed in the Journal, is frankly Senator Warner, and I think Senator Withem approved of this change or thought it was better. And the reason for the amendment is we have to have some firm commitments made on the education part. And LB 132, my priority bill, addresses the education parts. So my substitute amendment would say on page 24, line 14, after "review" insert "followed by approval or disapproval" in line 15, and strike "March 1" and insert "June 30". And I would ask for unanimous consent to substitute my second amendment, printed, for the first one.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Is there any objection? Seeing none, go ahead, Senator Nelson.

SENATOR NELSON: I think I fairly well explained, and maybe Senator Withem or Senator Warner, or someone else, or any questions, I'll be glad to ask (sic). On page 24, in the original bill, any education center developed and established on or after November 6, 1990, which is past now, shall be deemed disapproved until approved as a new program by the commission. The initial review of approval or disapproval of all academic centers established after such date shall be completed by June 30, 1992. And the reason of that...part of that being is that we all know the coordinating commission will have a tremendous job on their hands. And if this was not in there, and the date, this could be the last thing that they would approve, could be two years or three years. And simply education park has some commitments and funding would be...would probably drop off, some of it would be withheld, and that is the reason. And it gives them the time from the time that they are originally, the coordinating commission, formed until June 30th to approve or disapprove of the education centers. And I might also add that this will delay Scottsbluff, and probably will delay Grand Island by one year. But, due to the timing and the new coordinating commission being formed, we are willing to accept that, even though it has not worked out the best in commitments and so on.
