

a lot of money in a plan, and we'll be able to show that, and I think we won't have any problems showing the commission that the centers will be viable in a way that they want to go. But what's important for us is to have a time line in there that the commission will look at us early on. We're more or less just sitting there waiting in the wings to get started. So I would urge the body to support this amendment that would allow some of the outlying communities to go ahead with the education centers upon the approval of the new commission.

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you. Senator Lynch, on the Nelson amendment.

SENATOR LYNCH: Could I ask, Mr. Chairman and members, could I ask a question of Senator Nelson.

SENATOR CONWAY: Senator Nelson.

SENATOR NELSON: Sure.

SENATOR LYNCH: Does this amendment, I know it's LB 123, your bill...

SENATOR NELSON: LB 132.

SENATOR LYNCH: LB 132? Well, but now this would be an administrative body that would help implement planning, is that what it is at each city level?

SENATOR NELSON: It's the coordinating commission that we are discussion earlier in LB 663.

SENATOR LYNCH: But is this another group of people? Is this...is this...is this the commission...

SENATOR NELSON: This will...

SENATOR LYNCH: ...commission or is this another group of people?

SENATOR NELSON: This is not another group of people. This will be the same when the education centers are established. And, incidentally, this was...

SENATOR LYNCH: No, let me...let me finish.
