

Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I agree with the amendment, but that entire provision related to the Governor removing people is something that I'm going to want to explore but at this point I will limit my remarks to expressing support for Senator Schimek's amendment. As Senator Conway said, it's all right for people on the Accountability Commission to be efficient, inefficient, but when we get to the real business, then we can't allow that.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Schimek, do you wish to speak again? Your light is on.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No, I have that on for later, thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Okay. Senator Conway, do you wish to speak to this amendment, the Schimek amendment?

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Madam President, simply to suggest that I am in support of the amendment. I don't have any problem with that particular provision of the question of efficiency. I understand the vagueness. We lifted that particular language, as Senator Schimek alluded to, straight out of the accountability disclosure language and that's why that was there. I assume that it had meaning then and so I...but I have no problem with that particular word being taken out.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Conway. Does anyone else wish to speak to this amendment to the amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Schimek?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Smith, I'm sorry. Did you wish to speak to this amendment? Okay. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No, I would just urge it's acceptance.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schimek. We will now vote on the Schimek amendment to the Conway amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.
