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SENATOR CONWAY: Correct. Under this proposal, under 580, like you say there was a salary base I guess and so, therefore, the costs would be much higher under 580 than what we'd find under our provision.

SENATOR CROSBY: Yeah, okay. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Crosby. Now...

SENATOR CROSBY: Well...if I have any time left, if anybody needs it they can have it. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: There is two minutes left. I will now recognize...Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, I just struck Senator Schimek, I was in such haste to reach my microphone and because of the way these rumor mongers around here will take a very innocent act and blow it out of all proportion, by the time I get to Omaha this evening I will have knocked Senator Schimek to the floor and stomped upon her so I want to clarify this right now. It was just a very gentle brushing that was unintentional, she was hovering over me which I did not object to, but in leaping to my feet I brushed her and I can see Chizek and some of these other rumor mongers on the scene so I had to get that straight. The point that I was trying to...

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The point that I was trying to get across earlier is that I think some of the language in the bill gives too much power to political parties and Senator Schimek and I are looking at trying to do something about that, so she may offer an amendment or I may, but we're not through with that particular point.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. I'll now recognize Senator Warner followed by Senators Wehrbein, Schimek, Withem and Chambers. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Conway, a couple of questions, too, for clarification. The State Election Commissioner I assume has no qualifications. Senator Conway.
