

What will change between now and then? Why should we bracket? As I said earlier, there are no federal regs written on site design or on facility design. Right here, disposal site suitability requirements for land disposal other than near surface, near surface is the old kick and roll in the ditch, where other than near surface, it says in parenthesis, (reserved). Not written, not available, they are working on them. That could change. I would hope it would. I would hope it would change and they would have them written before we build our facility. I would definitely hope that would happen. Our own regs could change. LB 837 does, indeed, say that we will deny access to these other states if they haven't signed onto it, but, folks, it doesn't mean hokey if they don't all sign onto it. If they don't all sign onto it and we deny them access, they meet, they vote, the potential vote could be four to one to throw Nebraska out of the contract. You have signed the land over to the state, they build the facility. They throw us out of the compact and we pay to build the next one in another state. It is in here. If you want to come and look at it, I will show you exactly. I have read it to you. I will show it to you, whatever you want. Or you can just listen to the people that don't have to make an argument and just say, no, that is wrong, he is wrong. It can happen, it might not happen, but if they don't all sign LB 837, and it doesn't get passed by the feds, it is not in effect. We have no protection. We have no protection, and then they can proceed to say you were bad boys for trying to make us put in writing what we promised you all those years, so we are going to throw you out of the compact. It is right here on my desk, right here if you want to read it. And then they can proceed to build a facility because we are signing the land away to them now on the license approval, and we can't stop them unless we go to court and fight Energy, and Louisiana Light and Power, and Kansas, and Oklahoma, and all these folks, and we fight them in court, maybe we will win a few years down the line. Maybe we will win. The possibility is real. I am not making it up. I have read it to you and it is right here. If you really even care to look, come on over and I will show it to you. I'd urge you to bracket the bill. That is when it is needed. That is when the Department of Environmental Control today said they will be ready to review the license. If, indeed, it is sufficient then, it might not be, they may need to review two or three more times like they have in California already. Folks, to bracket is the thing to do. I'd urge your support.
