SENATOR CROSBY: Well, I understand that part but I'm talking about suitable arrangements, what does that mean to you?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: If suitable arrangements have been made, that means we talked to U.S. Ecology, Don Deold, this afternoon and he said, yeah, we can negotiate now for settlement on the submittal of the approved license application. All we have to do then is sign. We have got the negotiations done. Just like in any land transfer that hinges on taking possession or hinges or getting your liquor license. If you're buying a liquor store...

SENATOR CROSBY: But suitable arrangements is some kind of agreement.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Yes.

SENATOR CROSBY: So what's wrong with the...

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Which is already...which is already existing.

SENATOR CROSBY: So what's wrong with the agreement that this bill...

SENATOR MORRISSEY: What's wrong with the agreement in existing state law? What's wrong with this...

SENATOR CROSBY: What's this? What does it say in state law?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: It says that when they give us the proposed license application and we say, yep, that's good, everything is fine, yeah, we're comfortable with shared liability with these other states, we give them the land. Or we take possession of
