board membership for their holding company, when it's traditionally been the same for their company board, it seems to me to make sense, and I recognize that it may be national policy to go to one-third. But I think one-fifth deals adequately with the problem, it guarantees outside directors, it guarantees that there will be some outside control, and I would simply encourage the body to return the bill to Select File for the purpose of that amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Horgan. We'll now vote on the motion to return LB 234 to Select File. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 1348 of the Legislative Journal.) 41 ayes, 0 nays, 1 present and not voting, 7 excused and not voting, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 356 passes. I'll now recognize Senator Crosby for a point of personal privilege.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Madam President.
