SENATOR MOORE: If...

SENATOR CHIZEK: But...

SENATOR MOORE: Can we prevent that from happening by passing this bill?

SENATOR CHIZEK: Well, Senator Moore, I'm not sure. But I will tell you this, if this bill is not passed, there is no way...

SENATOR MOORE: Okay.

SENATOR CHIZEK: ...that Senator Robak or any of the other areas that lost a judge would get it back. Now, you know that...I'm on your time, but do you want me to...

SENATOR MOORE. Yes, please.

SENATOR CHIZEK: We have some bills on redistricting. But even if we redistrict, in the extreme, the caseload will need to be addressed. The court, from the Supreme Court to one of the district judges who heads up an association assured the committee that they would be back to us next year with a redistricting plan that we could all accept. So we'll, Senator, we'll have to wait and see.

SENATOR MOORE: Well, then one final question, Senator Chizek, as far as the redistricting plan, I mean, regardless of what we do on the redistricting, to even make that a workable process we need two additional...Douglas County has such an acute problem, to even begin talking about it, we're going to need to have these two new judges at least to make it work.

SENATOR CHIZEK: Yes, we'll need two.

SENATOR MOORE: But I just want to make it clear...

SENATOR CHIZEK: But that doesn't mean...

SENATOR MOORE: ...some people have the opinion, if we pass this bill, that you'll not get the other additional one. But that's in your...
