SENATOR ASHFORD: Right.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: ...but the person I loan it to, if it's not a family member and it's a friend going out of my sight, would need a buyer's card for me to loan it to them.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Okay, yes, they would.

SENATOR ASHFORD: There is no registration because the permit is given annually or received annually and the purchasers of the handguns are not done...or a permit is not obtained for each purchase so there is no record by law enforcement of each firearm purchaser or buyer.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Okay, so I would have to go to the police and get this and they could have up to two days, if they knew me, probably grant it immediately.

SENATOR ASHFORD: That's correct.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: If they were in question, they would have up to two days to check records.

SENATOR ASHFORD: That's correct.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: And what happens if after two days the computers are all down and they couldn't find any reports?

SENATOR ASHFORD: I'm sorry, excuse me, Senator Morrissey.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: If they take over...if it's up to two days and the computers or whatever are still down and they haven't come to a decision, then what happens?

SENATOR ASHFORD: If...if they...if...for that reason, they would have to give them a permit.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Then I get the permit.

SENATOR ASHFORD: If it's denied, that's when the appeal process...
