

who should, in fact, collect, and who should, in fact, pay that tax.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Thank you, Senator Lynch. I agree with you wholeheartedly that it will probably get some attention from the Department of Revenue, perhaps not exactly the kind that I might like. On the other hand, I believe that we are not going to escape this session without having some major changes in the revenue statutes. And I would...I'm still withholding judgment as to how I'm going to vote, I guess. But I would believe that there will be some opportunity to add definitive language as we proceed with the session and we address the major revenue issues that we're going to have to discuss in the course of resolving some of the conflicts that we already have. Thank you again.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schmit. Does anyone else wish to speak on this issue? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Lynch?

SENATOR LYNCH: Madam President, members, I apologize again for taking the time at this point in time. As far as Senator Hall is concerned, I would agree, I'm sorry I didn't do it sooner so we could have had maybe more time, except that I think the time we have taken does indicate the number of things that we would have only probably talked about longer, should we have had a day or two to discuss them. But for the most part I think the issue has been very well covered. I'd like to simply point out one more time that this is not an attempt to avoid a tax, it's simply an attempt to be fair to an industry, the florists in this particular case, all across the state. And rather than burden them because of policy for collecting taxes, we should, in fact, burden ourselves with how that tax should be collected. That's about as simple as it is and the bottom line. They are willing to cooperate with us. And I think it behooves us to make sure that we do the work we should do to make sure how that tax should be collected. I think this legislation would help us, in fact, accomplish that. And I'd ask for your support.
