SENATOR MORRISSEY: Okay, thank you. I'm still going to support the amendment by Senator Chizek. A couple questions of Senator Chizek.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Chizek, would you respond?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Senator, Section 4 of your amendment, and maybe this has been answered, but the grounds for denial, does that go back to...or revocation, that goes back to Section 2 in that 18 U.S.C. 922(g) or (h)?

SENATOR CHIZEK: Yes.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: And that's the things you have described already, the felon...

SENATOR CHIZEK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: ...or drug addict,...

SENATOR CHIZEK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: ...etcetera, etcetera? Okay, then how we decide or determine that someone that has one is thus qualified, when they fall under those same statutes, federal statutes?

SENATOR CHIZEK: Yes.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Okay, and if a law enforcement officer is aware that he has issued a permit and that person is now a felon or whatever, a drug addict, I guess that might be a little tricky, but they can go out and pull that then?

SENATOR CHIZEK: That's correct.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Okay, thank you, sir. Folks, I'm really pretty happy with a lot of my people down there because they have said this is something they can support. And I truly believe that 801 is less effective and potentially more onerous, if you can use that word, for the concerns of the people that think this is really inhibiting their right to go out and purchase a gun. I think this is very simple. Just like a
