Senator Schellpeper, did you wish to discuss this amendment?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you, Mr. Chairman and members. I think these amendments are not really needed. But rather than to fight over them, I guess I will accept the amendments. But I think they're amendments that we could do without. Senator Beutler wants to put them on, so I will accept the amendments. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Wesely, did you wish to discuss the Beutler amendment?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes. Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Having had a chance to review these only briefly, they don't appear to make much of a difference, or are of little or no consequence, really, in the bill. In some ways I guess you could look at them as sort of nuisance amendments, but I know that they're well-intended, and so I guess there will be no problem adopting them to the bill, but I don't think they have much of an impact on the legislation.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Senator Haberman, did you wish to discuss the amendment? Senator Beutler, did you wish to close on your amendment? No one else's light is on.

SENATOR BEUTLER: No, Mr. Speaker, I won't take up any more time.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. We will now proceed to vote on the Beutler amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the Beutler amendment. Have you all voted? We're voting on the Beutler amendment. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? We're voting on the amendment by Senator Beutler. Have you all voted? Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Call in votes, that would be wonderful, I guess. I don't really want to ask for a call of the house.
