SENATOR CROSBY: Okay.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...legal residence just like the Supreme Court judges.

SENATOR CROSBY: From where...just like the Supreme Court...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Right. The way it's drafted, I still think that's true, but to make it clear, I have an amendment which is coming that...

SENATOR CROSBY: Okay. Thank you.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...says they'll keep their legal residence,...
