

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes, there...there's...

SENATOR CROSBY: Okay.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...an amendment that we put on, in General File, that was Senator...

SENATOR CROSBY: That's what...I remembered that, but I...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Right, Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR CROSBY: But, as I say, by now I'm getting a little confused.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I can't blame you.

SENATOR CROSBY: And I don't mean that in a..., Rex, I just wanted to be sure that I understood what we were doing as we go along here. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Crosby. Senator Kristensen, you are next.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. I also object to this amendment, primarily because this amendment is worded as an amendment to the prior amendment, which we defeated. So this amendment doesn't attach to anything, because the prior amendment wasn't passed. So it doesn't flow, and it doesn't make any sense. Even if we can cure that problem, it's the same thing that we had in the first amendment, where it says that they shall maintain their office in the judicial district where they...he or she was appointed. I think that my amendment covers those sorts of things that we will have, but this amendment just doesn't attach to anything, because it was never passed, the original one. With that, I would also oppose this amendment. Thank you.
