SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard Senator Wehrbein's closing on the motion to bracket. We will now proceed to vote on this motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'd like to be sure everyone is here and I ask for a roll call vote, please. I know they all should be here. I don't know...everyone check in, please.

SPEAKER BAACK: We are technically on Final Reading. Would all members please check in. Check in, please. Senator Robinson, please check in. We need Senator Beyer, Senator Morrissey, Senator Labedz. All members are present. Mr. Clerk, please proceed with the roll call.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote. See page 1464 of the Legislative Journal.) 22 ayes, 26 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to bracket.

SPEAKER BAACK: The motion to bracket fails. Before we proceed, I would like to introduce some guests of the Legislature. They are from the Nebraska Federation of Women's Clubs. There is 56 members of that. Iris Kohler (phonetic), the President, and Jean Kolterman, the coordinator, and they are all in the south balcony. Would you please stand and be welcomed by the Legislature. Thank you for being with us. Mr. Clerk, next item.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wehrbein would move to return the bill for a specific amendment. Senator Wehrbein's amendment is on page 1397 of the Journal.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. Speaker and members, I simply ask that you consider before Nebraska leads the nation or second in the nation or whatever we're going to be, let's be sure other states are going to do this too.
