CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to cease debate.

SPEAKER BAACK: Debate has ceased. Senator Wehrbein, do you wish to close on your amendment.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. Speaker, members, just briefly, I submit that it is not necessarily good for Nebraska. We don't really know if it is or isn't. We don't have to make such quick steps and it would be better to wait and see and see if other states really think this is, as well as give us time ourselves to study the matter more fully, but, with that, I'd urge adoption or return to Select File for the proposed amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. We will now proceed to vote on returning the bill to Select File for a specific amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 25 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: The bill is not returned. Anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing further, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Proceed to read the bill. We are on Final Reading.

CLERK: (Read LB 115 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER BAACK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 115 pass?
