

colleges as well as the institutions which are named in the bill. We also indicated that with respect to nonresident appraisers they could come into Nebraska, they could do their work so long as there was reciprocal registration licensure or certification available for our appraisers in other states. And I would urge the adoption of the amendments and then permit Senator Beutler to discuss the particulars of the bill. I ask for the adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is there discussion on the committee amendments? Senator Lamb, did you wish to discuss the committee amendments? Oh, excuse me, Senator Lamb, we do have an amendment to the committee amendments first. That was my...

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Beutler would move to amend the committee amendments. (The Beutler amendment appears on pages 1477-78 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, I would hold that to be an amendment to the general bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Okay. Senator Lamb, on the committee amendments then.

SENATOR LAMB: Well, Mr. President and members, I have had a lot of comment about this bill from people in my legislative district and their comments are that we won't be able to find very many licensed appraisers in the whole district, be a 100 miles or so between appraisers. That's my problem. I guess my question of Senator Landis, if he would yield, is this. Has anything been...is there anything in the committee amendments which alleviates some of the problems that arise from particularly the 2,000-hour requirement?

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Lamb, there will be an amendment forthcoming offered by Senator Beutler which will make an alternative available to potential licensees. But with respect to your question, there is not a reduction in the amount of training necessary to meet the standards of the bill in the committee amendments. There are the continuation of some existing exemptions. So, in that sense, the number of
