SENATOR SMITH: See, that's what I wish I knew too.

SENATOR SMITH: You mean in the state?

SENATOR BEUTLER: In the state.

SENATOR SMITH: In the state, okay. All right, and what you're saying is that there are some that would qualify, a number of them that would qualify by giving... by this amendment then so that they have another year's time in order to come up to par, you might say. What about the training requirements? Do you know about that at this point in time? Do they already have training that they may have already taken, that they could comply with the training requirements? Or would that have to be something that they would have to hurriedly get too?

SENATOR BEUTLER: If, by training requirements, you mean the education requirements, they already have education requirements and many of those hours would also apply.

SENATOR SMITH: Have already been accumulated.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Would apply to the higher categories.

SENATOR SMITH: Okay. All right, maybe I'll just... I think you've answered the questions I have for this amendment. I'm supportive of this.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.
