SENATOR HARTNETT: So some of the people...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, no, well, that's not...that's not what they're called but that's fine, yeah.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay. So some of the people have already passed the federal exam at the second level? They've already taken the exam? Some appraisers in the state have taken the second exam?

SENATOR BEUTLER: No, I don't...I don't...

SENATOR HARTNETT: The past federally approved exam, I guess, is what I see as one of the...one is a state...under number 6 on your first page of your handout, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah. No, I don't think any of them can take the exam, Senator, until...until they've approved of our law and that's...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Oh.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...that's, basically, you've nailed the hang-up. They have not approved of our law, consequently we're not able to give the test. Consequently, we're slowed down to the point where we're in danger of having to use appraisers from other states.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay. Okay, and then go to the 2,000 hours of appraiser-related experience. If I am appraising now, been doing it, you know, in '90 and '91, can I count that as part of my 2,000 hours? Or does it start when we pass the bill?

SENATOR BEUTLER: No, no, I'm sure you can get credit for your exper...your past experience, all of your past experience,...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...all of your past experience.

SENATOR HARTNETT: All right, thank you.
