SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. You have heard the closing. We will now proceed to vote on the advancement of LB 203. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 203.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 203 is advanced. We will now go to LB 203A introduced by Senator Beutler.

CLERK: Mr. President, 203A, introduced by Senator Beutler. (Read title.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, this is merely the Cash Fund, Cash Fund only A bill to go along with 203, designed to cover what the costs are estimated to be as best one can do that at this point in time. And I would have to, frankly, say that that's a difficult task. But it involves approximately \$36,000 for '71-72 (sic) and \$28,000 for '92-93. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is there any discussion on the A bill for 203? Seeing none, we will proceed to vote on 203A. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We're voting on the advancement of LB 203A.
