ASSISTANT CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: The bill is returned. We will now go to the amendment offered by Senator Warner. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the amendment as I explained it.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is there any discussion on the adoption of the amendment? Seeing none, do you wish to close, Senator Warner? Waives closing. We will now proceed to vote on the amendment as offered by Senator Warner. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted. Senator Will, do you wish to readvance the bill.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. Speaker, I move for the readvancement of LB 240 to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to readvance LB 240. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is readvanced. Now go to LB 648.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, with respect to LB 648, I do have a motion from Senator Warner to return the bill to Select File for specific amendment. The amendment is found on page 1426.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this bill dealt with the Nebraska Commission on the Status of Women. It was introduced by Senator Smith and others the other day, and it was one that broadened some of their responsibilities and authority. But one of the things that it did also, if you looked on line 9 of the bill, it permitted them to promote, develop, or offer programs or services and needs. As I understood, in visiting with Senator Smith, the reason that the bill came up and that particular language was that they had been in a cooperative program with another agency, which they were to
