with existing programs, state agencies and other entities. And I understand the intent of the bill is to authorize the first class cities to provide financial assistance in cooperation with already existing program systems and networks, so they aren't going to attempt to duplicate, but rather supplement and compliment current programs. And if that's the understanding, that is no problem, and I'll withdraw the amendment. But he's not here to confirm that, but that's what I understand his point to be. So I thought it would be important to make that for the record. With that, I'll withdraw the motion.

SPEAKER BAACK: Motion is withdrawn. Any other items on the bill? You may read the bill, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 810 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER BAACK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 810 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 1508 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 41 ayes, 0 nays, 3 present and not voting, 5 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 810 passes. Do you have items for the record, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I do, Mr. President. Thank you. I have an explanation of vote from Senator Schrock. Your Committee on Government, whose Chair is Senator Conway, reports LB 463 to General File with committee amendments attached, signed by Senator Conway as Chair of the committee.
