SPEAKER BAACK: Time.

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...District, and the Nuckolls County Agricultural Society. LB 761 provided that half of the money that would allocated to a county would be distributed, based upon population, to municipalities that were located in part or all within ten kilometers of the proposed site, and that the other 50 percent of the money would be distributed to taxing subdivisions who had an interest in that particular site that was chosen, or had the potential to be chosen...

SPEAKER BAACK: Time, Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...as a site. So we have a situation, and I'll have to renew my light for about a minute, unless Senator Morrissey will give me some of his time.

SPEAKER BAACK: The other speakers that I have on the list, Senator Pirsch, did you wish to address this amendment?

SENATOR PIRSCH: I will give him the first minute, but I would like to speak.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Pirsch yields the first minute to Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Okay. So then to finish up on what I said, the money has already been distributed. Two counties received it under the old system, one county under the new system. The money is gone. It was the determination of the board, not unanimous decision certainly of Business and Labor Committee that were we to allow this claim it would lead to a substantial amount of claims from other subdivisions in Nemaha and Boyd County at another year. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you. I...I...you did answer one of my questions, Senator Coordsen. But actually in some ways I'm more confused. And, Senator Morrissey, maybe you can help me out, too. As I understand, we changed the rules in the middle of the stream, so to speak, in 1989. And only one county, under this, would receive this money under 769. Is that correct?
