SENATOR MORRISSEY: Under 761, one county received...

SENATOR PIRSCH: 761.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: ...it under the proper distribution, two under the improper distribution. I don't know how the time frames worked in the other counties, other than my own. I have the fact that...

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: ...they had distributed no money.

SENATOR PIRSCH: So...but the upshot was that only one county was really considered for distribution, and that was the county that actually received the low-level site?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: No, no, all three counties got this, all three preliminary counties got this \$100,000 funding.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay. So...so your county, the county that the Johnson-Brock School District was in did receive money?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: The county did receive money, the school district was owed money, did not get money.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Hmmm. Were there other subdivisions, taxing subdivisions that did not receive money then...

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Yes.

SENATOR PIRSCH: ...along with Johnson-Brock? How many of those are there?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Well, I...other than the county, it would be all the other political subdivisions. The school board is the only one that picked up on the improper distribution by the DEC and came to the board.

SENATOR PIRSCH: So if we...if we do approve this, then that kind of opens the door to those others who did not get distribution, too.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: The others who were wrongly left out, yes.
