They asked for that clarification twice, after the new law has changed. Their argument has absolutely no weight. It's a lame attempt to make an excuse for their bumbling of this matter, and I would hope that we, as a body, would say, yes, the laws that we pass should be enforced; yes, you state agencies should pay attention to the laws we pass, especially the ones that affect you, and you should comply with those laws. Less than \$100,000 out...none of it out of General Funds, it's out of radioactive waste funds, meant to be used by the host state. We should do it. The Natural Resources Committee said we should do it, the body said we should do it, the Governor said we should do it, and the DEC decided that they wouldn't do it. It's good policy, it's the proper thing to do, and it won't cost any money out of the General Funds. I'd urge you, please, to support my amendment. Thank you.
