Now, if it was \$2,338.50, I probably could see some rationale. Scotty Moore says you can go home and tell Hazel I gave it the good old college try, that's not the purpose of my amendment, Scott Moore. My amendment is here's a constituent who went through the process. You haven't had any other claims that you can stand up and say they went through the process. You can throw up your hands and say, oh, if we do this one, we're going to do hundreds of them. That's smoke screen. Let's judge them when they come before us and vote on it. So I ask this body...this will be my closing, Mr. President. I ask this body to support the amendment to award this little old lady her \$238.50 for the windshield that she says the state broke. I'm not going to call her liar, you can call her a liar, but I'm not going to do it. So I ask you to vote yes on the amendment. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the closing on the amendment offered by Senator Haberman. We will now proceed to vote on the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Are we under call?

SENATOR HABERMAN: I'll take a roll call, Mr. President.
