LB 355, 801, 850

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment fails. Next item on the bill.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is there anyone wishing...We are now on the advancement of LB 850. Does anyone wish to discuss the bill? Senator Coordsen, do you wish to close?

SENATOR COORDSEN: Only to move the advancement of LB 850. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to advance LB 850. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 850.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 850 is advanced. I will raise the call now, but I certainly would encourage my colleagues to stay close around, because we are having difficulty getting any work done because we don't have enough people here. It took us a little over 30 minutes today to get a quorum. If we continue to do that, we're not going to get a lot of things done that you want to have done this session. So I would encourage you to stay close around. And colleagues that are in your office, if you can, please come back to the floor so we can conduct business. We will proceed to LB 355, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 355 was a bill originally introduced by Senator Ashford and a number of members. (Read title.) The bill has been discussed by the Legislature, Mr. President, on March 27, again on March 28, at which time an amendment by Senator Chizek was offered. At that same date Senator Ashford offered an amendment. Senator, this is AM0847.

SENATOR ASHFORD: That's correct.

CLERK: Page 1407 of the Journal.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Thank you, Mr. Clerk.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Ashford.
