CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1515-16 of the Legislative Journal.) 24 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment fails. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Haberman. (Haberman amendment appears on page 1516 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the body, I wish to apologize. I handed the amendment in a couple days ago, but I did not say the magic words, please print it, so it wasn't printed, so I'll read it to you. "The provisions of Sections 1 to 15 of this act shall only apply to the purchase, sale, lease, rental, or transfer of handguns in cities having a population of one hundred thousand inhabitants or more."

SPEAKER BAACK: Call is raised.
