commission. Then the length of the stretch that would be zoned by the county would be up to the county. That would be their decision to make on that.

SENATOR HARTNETT: What do you envision, Senator Lamb? Do you have any idea?

SENATOR LAMB: What do I envision? I envision the...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Seventeen miles, or...

SENATOR LAMB: I don't know.

SENATOR HARTNETT: ...(inaudible).

SENATOR LAMB: I would like to leave it in the hands of those people to make that determination that they would then have that freedom, because I don't think we here can look at every river in the state and decide that there is a danger that the river would deteriorate. But I would like to leave it up to the Natural Resources Commission, in the first place, and then to the counties, in the second place, to make that determination.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay, a situation, a county or the Natural Resource Commissions could say 20 miles and the county can go back and say 10 miles or five miles. Is that what...

SENATOR LAMB: That could happen. That could happen, yes. Under the provisions of the bill, that could happen.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, I would move to adjourn until nine o'clock tomorrow morning.

SPEAKER BAACK: Do you have items for the record, Mr. Clerk?
