

but I have not addressed that in this bill. It's a separate...in my opinion, that's a separate issue that should be addressed and is addressed separately in other sections of present law.

SENATOR HILLMAN: So with your amendment, you're just looking at the ground adjacent to the river and has nothing to do with instream flows whatsoever?

SENATOR LAMB: That's correct.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR WARNER: Further discussion. Senator Lamb, do you wish to close?

SENATOR LAMB: Yes, Mr. President, just very briefly. I would like to comment on Senator Beutler's statement that different counties could do different things with their stretch of the river and that is correct, that's correct. But I would submit that different cities do different things within their cities also. The zoning regulations are not the same in Omaha, in Lincoln, and in Scottsbluff. That is left to local control and that is what this bill is all about. We want to protect those streams, but we want to do it locally, and so his statement that different counties could do different things in their zoning regulations or do nothing is correct in most cases, but that's not bad in my opinion. I think that's good, that these entities of government can look at the situation, decide what needs to be done and do it, not rely on the state or the federal government to come in with regulations that may or may not fit the case. I would ask that the amendment be adopted.

SENATOR WARNER: The motion is the adoption of the Lamb amendment. Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, I'm afraid I will be forced to ask for a call of the house and call in votes would be accepted.

SENATOR WARNER: A call of the house is requested. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, the house is under call, members, please check in. Call in votes are accepted.
