SENATOR LAMB: (Microphone not activated) ...house. I think we will need it.

SPEAKER BAACK: We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor of the house going under call vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to go under call.

SPEAKER BAACK: The house is under call. All members please report to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: I would ask for a roll call, please.

SPEAKER BAACK: Roll call vote has been requested. The house is under call. All members please report to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. Looking for Senators Chambers and Pirsch. Senator Moore, please record your presence. Senator Wickersham, please record your presence. Looking for Senator Chambers, Senator Lynch. Senator Lynch, would you please record your presence. Senator Chambers is on his way, do you wish to start Senator Lamb? Senator Chambers is the last one. Mr. Clerk, call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1548 of the Legislative Journal.) 24 ayes, 17 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement.

SPEAKER BAACK: The motion fails. We will now move to the next bill, LB 783. The call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, 783 was a bill introduced by Senators Lamb, Dierks, Wickersham, Peterson, Morrissey, Schellpeper, Coordsen and Elmer. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 23, referred to the Transportation Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File.
